Project Description:

Conversion, restoration and extension of building to community use including refurbishment of caretakers flat

Construction details:

Works are being carried out to convert and renovate the existing church and hall to provide a small chapel and rest area, community centre comprising of a new meeting rooms, upgraded kitchen and toilets, single storey link corridor, and residential accommodation.

Internal alterations consist of:

- Demolition of the old corridor and the rooms that opened off it
- removal of a stage and filling of the large cavity beneath
- New Mechanical and electrical services works
- Building a new hexagonal wall which will separate the previous altar from the hall to create a small chapel and rest area

External remodelling consists of:

- a new extension to the front of the building to create new ladies and gents toilets with disabled adaptations, store room and kitchen
- Disabled entrance ramps
- The external staircase was removed and a new entrance and stairwell to the caretaker's flat will be created



The rubble produced from the demolition works was recycled and used to fill the large cavity under the previous stage
